

JOINT DECLARATION ON THE COMMON SPACE IN SOUTHEAST ASIAN HIGHER EDUCATION

WE, SEAMEO Member Countries and ASEAN Member States;

REAFFIRMING the Cha-Am Hua Hin Declaration on Strengthening Cooperation on Education to Achieve an ASEAN Caring and Sharing Community, adopted at Cha-Am Hua Hin Thailand on 24 October 2009:

ACKNOWLEDGING the principles adopted at the Declaration of ASEAN Concord II (Bali Concord II) in Bali, Indonesia on 7 October 2003 to establish the ASEAN Community by 2020;

RECALLING the 2015 Kuala Lumpur Declaration on the establishment of the ASEAN Community, the 2015 Kuala Lumpur Declaration on Higher Education, and the ASEAN Community Vision 2025, which established the ASEAN Community, acknowledged the important role of higher education in accelerating ASEAN Community-building and set the post-2015 ASEAN Community agenda towards realising a rules-based, people-oriented, people-centred ASEAN of "One Vision, One Identity, One Community":

RECOGNISING the shared agenda of ASEAN and SEAMEO on harmonising higher education and research in the region as reflected in the ASEAN Work Plan on Education 2021-2025 and SEAMEO Education Agenda;

WELCOMING the progress made in implementing the ASEAN Community Vision 2025 and acknowledging the ongoing work towards the ASEAN Community Vision 2045;

COMMENDING the ongoing efforts in implementing the ASEAN 5-Year Work Plan on Education 2021-2025 and the SEAMEO Strategic Plan 2021-2030:

STRESSING the importance of cooperation among ASEAN Member States towards the formation of the ASEAN Community and harmonising the higher education common space agenda of SEAMEO;

 ASEAN-SEAMEO Joint Declaration on the Common Space in Southeast Asian Higher Education adopted at the 13th ASEAN Education Ministers Meeting (ASED) in Buriram, Thailand, on 25 August 2024

 The Joint Declaration reaffirms the strong and lasting partnership between ASEAN and SEAMEO





ASEAN LEADERS' DECLARATION ON HIGHER EDUCATION: TOWARDS AN INCLUSIVE. SUSTAINABLE AND PROSPEROUS ASEAN

We, ASEAN Member States, consisting of Brunei Darussalam, the Kingdom of Cambodia, the Republic of Indonesia, the Lao People's Democratic Republic, Malaysia, the Republic of the Union of Myanmar, the Republic of the Philippines, the Republic of Singapore, the Kingdom of Thailand, and the Socialist Republic of Viet Nam, on the occasion of the Forty Seventh (47th) Summit in Kuala Lumpur.

RECALLING the Kuala Lumpur Declaration on Higher Education 2015 which outlines the direction of higher education in ASEAN between 2015 and 2025;

ACKNOWLEDGING the formation of the ASEAN Community in 2015 and the adoption of the ASEAN Vision 2025 to deepen the ASEAN integration process, through among others, the realisation of a rules-based, people-oriented, people-centred ASEAN Community, where ASEAN peoples may enjoy higher quality of life and the benefits of community building; enhanced capacity to respond effectively to challenges; and ASEAN as a region as an outward-looking region within a global community of nations, while maintaining ASEAN centrality;

RECALLING the ASEAN Socio-cultural Community Blueprint 2025, to enhance the competitiveness of ASEAN human resources through the promotion of life-long learning, pathways, equivalencies, and skills development as well as the use of information and communication technologies across age groups; promote an innovative ASEAN approach to higher education, incorporating academics, community service, regional placement, and entrepreneurship incubation and support; encourage regional cooperation in the areas of education, training and research, and strengthen ASEAN's role in regional and global research network by promoting initiatives and providing incentives and support for research and development, including research publications; promote the free flow of ideas, knowledge, expertise, and skills to inject dynamism within the region;

ACKNOWLEDGING initiatives to implement the ASEAN Socio-cultural Community Blueprint 2025 including the Declaration on Digital Transformation of Education Systems in ASEAN 2022, the Declaration on the ASEAN Comprehensive Recovery Plan 2020, the Joint Declaration on the Common Space in Southeast Asian Higher Education, the Roadmap of the ASEAN Declaration on Human Resources Development for the Changing World of Work 2020, and the ASEAN Digital Masterplan 2025;


