


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AUN Board of Trustees' Meeting

The AUN Board of Trustees Meeting is one of the core AUN meeting platforms held annually back-to-back with the AUN Rectors' Meeting. Recently, the AUN-BOT Meeting is arranged in a lean format to report the key results of AUN in the past year and to discuss a direction for future collaboration of the AUN Member Universities towards the path of regional higher education within ASEAN and beyond.

The AUN Board of Trustees (AUN-BOT) consists of ten representatives, designated one each from the ten ASEAN Member States, the Secretary-General of ASEAN, the Chairman of the Senior Officials Meeting on Education (SOM-ED), the Secretary-General of the Office of the Higher Education Commission, Ministry of Education, Thailand, as an ex-officio member and the Chairman of the AUN Board of Trustees, and the AUN Executive Director.

AUN Rectors' Meeting

AUN Rectors' Meeting is geared as a platform showcasing past achievements and forward-looking strategies of AUN-related projects, programmes and activities organised by AUN Member Universities and stakeholders. The Meeting's activities are often designed to initiate a fruitful and engaging dialogue among Presidents, Rectors, Chancellors, and Vice-Chancellors of the AUN Member Universities who are thought-leaders and great contributors to the work and success of the Network, with a goal of paving ways for the future of ASEAN Higher Education.

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ASEAN+3 Heads of International Relations Meeting

The ASEAN+3 Heads of International Relations Meeting serves as a practical platform for Vice Presidents or their representatives from ASEAN+3 UNet University International Relations Offices to engage in discussions and enhance student and academic mobility within the region. The outcomes include recommendations and initiatives aimed at tackling obstacles and enhancing the quality of international educational partnerships.

Each annual meeting focuses on a specific theme determined through consultations between the host university and the AUN Secretariat. The primary result of these meetings is a deliverable, report, or framework produced through collaborative work involving the host university and the attendees.




ASEAN+3 Rectors' Conference

The ASEAN+3 Rectors' Conference, held every two years, aims to offer a platform for university leaders from ASEAN and Plus Three countries to address and deliberate on future challenges. The ASEAN Plus Three (APT) includes ten ASEAN Member States, along with China, Japan, and South Korea. Originating in December 1997, the APT Cooperation process has developed into a key mechanism for fostering East Asian Cooperation, with the ultimate objective of establishing an East Asian Community, with ASEAN leading the way through joint initiatives.

Background

- The concept of the AUN Summer Camp was first put forward during the 14th AUN Rectors' Meeting and 38th AUN Board of Trustees (BOT) Meeting by Prof. Tan Eng Chye, President of the National University of Singapore (NUS) for a short-term cross-border experiential initiative by AUN Member Universities.
- The two-week programme of each campsite includes activities and challenges that are expected to help participating students develop a set of selected competences to flourish in the future of Asia and global society. In addition, the programme also fosters a spirit of regional unity and cooperation among ASEAN countries.
- In 2024, AUN Summer Camp was launched for the first time, uniting over 1,020 talents from 71 ASEAN universities, 14 countries (10 ASEAN countries as well as China, Japan, South Korea and India) in 9 concurrent summer camps spanning across 7 countries over the period of four months from June to September. Within the total number of participating students in this year's programme, 805 students are from the 10 ASEAN countries.



ASEAN and ASEAN+3 Youth Cultural Forum (AYCF)

The AUN and ASEAN+3 Youth Cultural Forum is an annual event that brings together youth from leading universities in the ASEAN region, China, Japan, and Korea to share their distinct cultures and values with one another. The Forum comprises cultural workshops, a cultural trip, as well as a space to perform unique traditional cultural performances.

AUN and ASEAN+3 Educational Forum and Young Speakers' Contest 2024

A platform of two synchronous events for students interested in public and global affairs/policymaking at national and international levels, ASEAN+3 Educational Forum and Young Speaker Contest provides a stage for interested participants to express their voices through the drafting of the ASEAN+3 Youth Statement in the forum, as well as through the speeches delivered in the speaking contest.



The ASEAN Student Leaders Forum (ASLF) is a platform that brings together young leaders from student associations and unions from 30 AUN Member Universities in a top-tier active learning opportunity for them to learn and initiate high-impact youth-led initiatives in their respective universities.

AUN ASEAN Experiential Learning (AELP)

The AUN ASEAN Experiential Learning Programme (AELP) is one of the flagship initiatives of the AUN Student Affairs Network (AUN-SAN). The AELP is a biannual activity that brings together undergraduates from AUN Member Universities for a 5-day learning programme that aims to offer real "in-the-field" learning and exposure experiences. These experiences will immerse the students in real social, economic, and environmental issues faced by ASEAN residents.

AUN Summer Camp

Concurrent Student Mobility Programmes organized by AUN Core Member Universities for young talents students from 10 ASEAN Countries

With the main objective of preparing the region's students with more advanced competences and knowledge essential for the leading global talents rooted in the ASEAN region, the AUN Summer Camp brings together the strengths and expertise of leading AUN Member Universities in organising two-week, concurrent and crossborder exchange programmes and stimulating interregional academic mobility of a large group of university students from 10 ASEAN countries.

Through knowledge building and capacity building sessions run by ASEAN's top universities and involving experts from the business and industry sector, participating students of the AUN Summer Camp are expected to graduate from this short-term programme with future-ready skills, knowledge and attidutes that can help them thrive in an ever-challenging global socioeconomic landscape.

This brand new initiative under AUN will also serve as a great platform for students, academics as well as professionals from industries and businesses to connect and contribute to each other's personal and professional growth - one which could last for a lifetime.







ASEAN-China Young Leaders Scholarship (ACYLS)

Establishing universal principles for recognition



The Global Convention on Higher Education and the regional Lisbon & Tokyo Conventions provide a foundation for mobility and qualifications recognition

- Establish universal principles for the recognition of qualifications (i.e. fair, transparent, and non-discriminatory)
- Open to UNESCO Member States to ratify
- Facilitate mobility through international cooperation
- Provide an inclusive framework for fair recognition






The Sustainable Development Goals and Education
