- 46 partner countries, European Commission and the ASEAN Secretariat


Phase I (2003-2007)

- Conceptualisation: 2nd General Meeting on the ASEM Education Hub, Singapore; ASEM Symposium on Educational Exchange, Japan (2003)
- Development: website design, data collection and migration (2005-2006)
- Launch in Singapore (April 2007)

Phase II (2008- early 2009)

- Update of data from 38 ASEM countries
- Communication strategy and initial implementation (DEEP Toolkit)





DEEP Toolkit



TO BE COMPLETED

- Collection of data from 5 additional ASEM countries
- Data migration
- Website enhancement



Evaluation Phase (mid 2009-Dec2011)

- Review of DEEP Portal (desk research, email exchanges, etc.)
- Discussions/meetings with potential partners



Practical Challenges

- Financial and human resource constraints
- Complex data collection (wide-ranging content, update methodology, etc.)
- Withdrawal of technical partner



Institutional Challenges

- Absence of an overall long-term strategy
- Expansion of ASEM (2008,2010)



DEEP at ASEF's Board of Governors' Meeting (December 2011)

- DEEP: not sustainable under the same conditions
- Launch of transfer to potential partners

SCENARIO 1 - DEEP AS IT IS

- Autonomous website (URL)
- Keep scholarships and country profiles/course data
- Update on a two-year basis by external providers



HOW TO CONTINUE DEEP?

Implementation requirements

 - 2 full-time Project Officers and 1 Intern

- Budget:
 - ~ SGD**532,000** (every two years)
