- in Berlin in 2008 (ASEMME1)
- in Hanoi in 2009 (ASEMME2)
- in Copenhagen in 2011 (ASEMME3)



 Next Ministerial Conferences in Malaysia (2013), Latvia (2015) and Republic of Korea (2017).



The history of the University-Business Forum (1)

1. Asia-Europe Meeting of Ministers for Education, Berlin 2008

The Meeting agreed:

• to propose the establishment of a <u>bi-regional forum involving stakeholders</u> <u>from the education and economic sector</u> to strengthen the dialogue and cooperation between education and industry at local, national and international level.

2. Asia-Europe Meeting of Ministers for Education, Hanoi 2009

The Meeting agreed:

•to set up the <u>ASEM University-Business Forum</u>, as agreed in the first Meeting in Berlin, to enhance exchange of views and good practices, and welcomed <u>Thailand</u> for volunteering to organise this activity.








The history of the University-Business Forum (2)

3. Asia-Europe Meeting of Ministers for Education, Copenhagen 2011

The Ministers:

- •agreed to make the <u>ASEM University-Business Forum</u> an annual event (...); <u>Germany</u> offers to host the second ASEM University-Business Forum in late 2011. <u>Malaysia</u> offers to host a stakeholder meeting in 2012;
- •invited the European Commission to link the ASEM University-Business Forum to the EU University-Business Forum and include a specific session with Asian and European representatives from academia and the world of work (...);
