In teams students design and implement a so-called COIL -Collaborative Online International Learning (COIL) element or module which seeks to connect students and professors in different countries (= both regions in the ASEM context) for collaborative projects and discussions in classes to provide meaningful, significant opportunities for global experiences and cultural awareness.
