Recommendation CM/Rec(2022)18 of the Committee of Ministers to member States on countering education fraud

Member States should ensure that the ETINED principles are promoted consistently by all education institutions and to all education stakeholders, and that education systems should set the same standards of quality and ethics for all institutions, regardless of their formal status in national education systems.

This should be achieved by taking appropriate measures to provide information on and raise awareness about the prevention of education fraud and, through linking, in theory and in practice, quality assurance and other appropriate regulatory mechanisms, to promote ethics, transparency and integrity in education at all levels in accordance with national legislation.
